Dear Valued Customer:

The California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (commonly known as Proposition 65) requires companies to provide a warning before knowingly exposing California consumers to one of over 900 listed chemicals. California has recently revised the Proposition 65 regulations to reflect that manufacturers have the primary responsibility for providing warnings where required. Motors and Armatures, Inc. ("MARS") has started including compliant warnings on certain products as a courtesy to our customers, and you may see those warnings on some of our product labels. Labels examples:

Proposition 65 Labeling on MARS Motor packaging




Please note that if you re-sell MARS products that include a Proposition 65 warning, in order to comply with Proposition 65 you must:

- 1) Provide a compliant website warning for all internet sales.
- 2) Provide a compliant shelf warning for all sales of products that are not sold in their original packaging (e.g. sales of individual batteries or other bulk-packaged items).
